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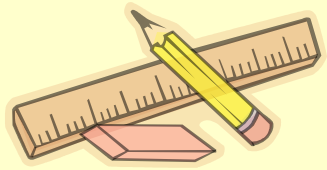

- How long do you want it to be?

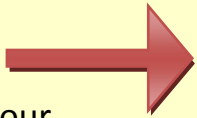


**CHOOSE SOME PICTURES THAT WILL HELP TO

- Decide what order you want to put your pictures in to tell your story.



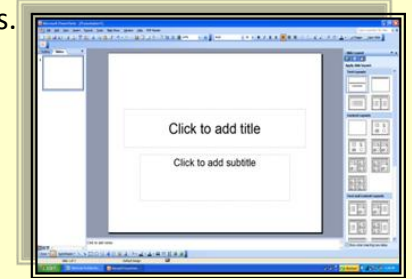

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You might want to put your portfolio in order by time or by different activities.

- You can use any awards or certificates you have received.
- Decided which computer program you are going to use for your electronic portfolio. We like PowerPoint.
- Scan the photo or CD photo into the computer.
- Type in the titles or sentences on the pages.
- You may want to add clip art, sound, or motion.
- You may want to save your story to memory stick, disc, and print a hard copy.



PowerPoint gives you a several slide layout choices:

Text Layout lets you enter a title and a space for information.

Control Layout gives you a title box, and lets you insert pictures, clip art, and other things.

Text and Content Layout gives you a separate space for text pictures.

For Inserting Pictures

Click on **Insert Picture**, it automatically forwards the picture to your picture folder (called **My Pictures**). Simply click on the picture you wish to insert and it will be added to your slide.
